Alnis's letter to his mother from „Sermuļi” farmstead

„Sermuļi”, September 29, 1946

Mummy, I have walked about and seen everything;
nothing has really changed very much. Only one is
immediately struck by the sight of the large, three
branch maple tree that now has only one branch left,
and that one rather ugly. My willows that I planted
along the drive in the spring have now grown large.
Kalniņš (little park on a hill created together with
parents) has grown too, but is still rather pretty.
The acacias have grown large also. Monday I will go
to school. Nora is in the fifth grade; she is doing well
in her studies and is the class president. She has the
books from the fourth grade that will be useful to me.
Aunt Lidija was very good and caring. When I left she
gave me a kind of large notebook with the alphabet.
It has 120 pages. She also gave me 20 pen tips and a
holder, a pencil and 30 envelopes. She also gave me
ten large sheets of paper.
